HEAR BOTH SIDES - REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN!

Former County Supervisor Katie Dusenberry (for the plan) and Campbell/Grant Neighborhood **President Ken O'Day** (opposed) will face off at the 2006 Flecha Caida Annual Meeting. The meeting will be held in the large upstairs room of Building F at the **First Evangelical Free Church, 4700 N. Swan**, as it has for some years. There will be **no dinner this year**, due to some logistical problems, but dessert, coffee and other beverages will be served.

Also on the agenda will be the election of new directors and the ratification of some 'housekeeping' changes to the By Laws.

The program will present the pros and cons of the plan that involves two items on the ballot on May 16th. One measure will approve or disapprove the plan itself; the other will be a vote for or against a one-half cent County sales tax to fund it. Included in the plan, along with such items as open space retention and the trolley from the university to downtown, is making Grant Road the major east-west artery, which would affect some homes and businesses in the corridor, as well as Tucson Medical Center and the medical facilities on the south side of the street. **This plan will AFFECT YOU!** Be an informed voter.

Longtime Flecha Caidans will remember Katie's appearances at Annual Meetings in the 1980's and many know her through her many community activities. Ken has lived in Tucson since 1988, is in the health care field and has been involved in transportation and other issues in the area where he lives. If you have received the booklet mailed out by the Regional Transportation Authority, please read it – or Katie's article in the March 10th AZ Daily Star (available on-line). Ken's points against can be viewed on his website: www.tucsonrealplan.com. It is vital that you attend this meeting to be informed – and to **vote on May 16th**. There will be questions from the floor following the presentations. Get your questions ready!

These are true stories from other Tucson neighborhoods. Thankfully, they are not our stories.

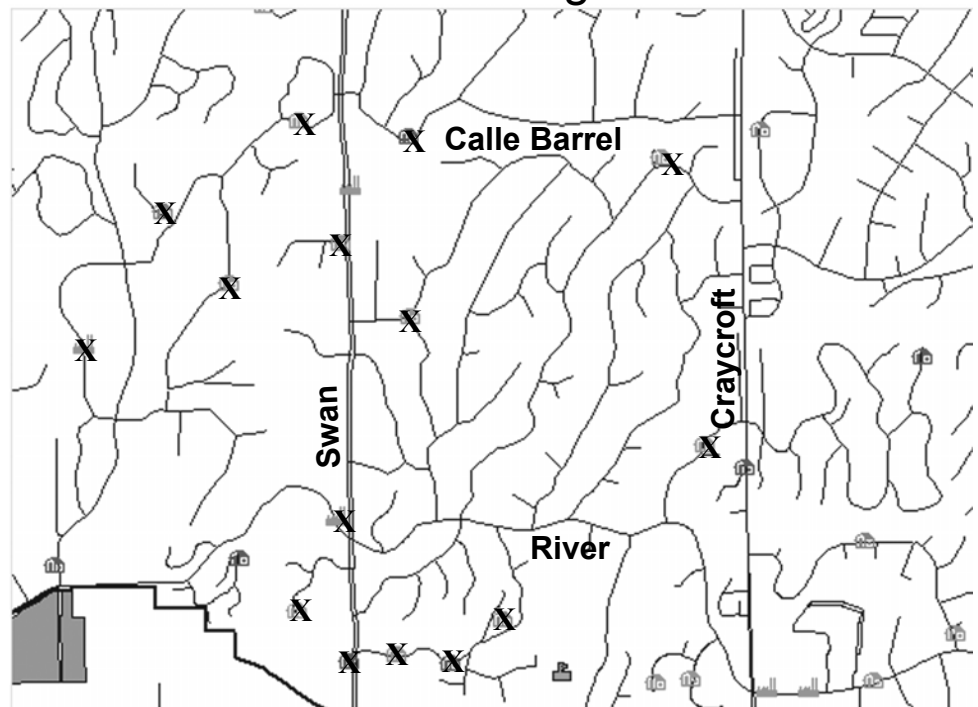

Update on Craycroft Road -The long awaited reconstruction of Craycroft Road is well underway. The work started with clearing and demolition on the west side of the intersection of Craycroft at Sunrise. Major clearing and utility work is underway and is progressing from north to south along the right of way. This phase is planned to reach River Rd. before the fall of 2006 at which time TEP will start work. When TEP finishes and initial paving of the west side is complete, traffic will be switched to the new portion of Craycroft.
